2022 was a year where Keeping It Sacred went from strength to strength!

In May of 2022, we acquired a Torah from three congregations in the midwest who had merged and found themselves with 27 Torahs altogether. We lovingly brought it into our community- and as appropriate, the Torah mantle reads: Shalom! Hello!

Then, in July, the Center for Rabbinic Innovation (CRI) recognized our cutting-edge community and determined it wanted to nurture our growth by naming me a CRI Fellow. This provides me with a community of rabbis selected for our out-of-the-box thinking, nationally-recognized experts, and resources to help scale our work.

Then, just before Hanukkah, the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) named Keeping It Sacred its newest member community. In doing so, we join progressive congregations everywhere invigorating Jewish life-helping one another to think more creatively, and benefitting from a vast array of resources. These developments helped us claim our space in the national landscape of Jewish life.

Our new website helped our community expand with over 256 new members from all over the world. Over 2,300 reservations were made for our programs, with our weekly newsletter being read a total of 17,411 times. People are thirsty for Torah and community and intellectual exploration of life's biggest questions, and our community is a great source for that! What's more is that members have shared stories of enjoying time with and supporting one another outside of official Keeping It Sacred program time. These relationships are meaningful and varied in so many important ways.

While we have been growing in the national and international arena, our new Keeping it Sacred community headquarters in Los Angeles have rooted us in a vibrant and well-resourced local community, as well.

We are now poised to develop with and encourage communities all around the world from our new home base. We are scaling thoughtfully and with great excitement and with the financial help from so many contributors.



In the wake of the shootings in Colleyville, Buffalo, Uvalde, and Laguna Woods, Keeping It Sacred was recognized for leading efforts to hold sacred space for reflection and healing. 




### **PURSUING JUSTICE**





Torah is meant to be studied for the sake of action. And at Keeping It Sacred, we bring the values of human dignity and global wellness to life through our social action. In 2022, the KITS community built upon our longstanding relationships with community organizers and participated in several actions and programs including the National Council of Jewish Women's annual Repro-Shabbat, the Poor People's Campaign against gun violence, and several actions calling out white supremacy with the Black Jewish Justice Alliance of CLUE, and Black Lives Matter. Our Rosh Chodesh Racial Justice Book Review also met with Patrisse Cullors to discuss her most recent book.


